COMMUNIST REVOLUTION, NOT LIBERAL REFORMISM, WILL DEFEAT FASCISM

LOS ANGELES (USA), June 14— President Trump stared sadly as out-of-step soldiers and creaky tanks paraded past half-empty bleachers at his birthday parade. Meanwhile, over a hundred thousand people attended dozens of "No Kings" protests in Los Angeles County.

Five million or more marched or rallied altogether. In every US state. In big cities and small towns. In some places, tens of thousands, elsewhere just brave individuals. In US territories and twenty other countries.

Two dozen party members and friends joined the ICWP Red Flag contingent in downtown LA. They came with varying levels of commitment. All brought their creativity and energy to our mobilization for communism. We distributed over a thousand pieces of communist literature, mainly to marchers but also to National Guards.

Solidarity and Hopeful Energy

"It was an impressive show of solidarity," reflected an activist. "But beneath that show, there is an undercurrent of commitment to action.

"There are real stakes in our own backyard," she continued. "Folks were sharing information and support. In a rising surveillance state, just being together in person is so



valuable."

"The energy felt really hopeful, which I hadn't felt lately," said a millennial. She was participating in a large protest for the first time, carrying an anti-fascist sign. "There were so many families, older folks, young people, dogs, and people of all races and cultures. People were complimenting each other's signs and introducing themselves."

A comrade heard a man say, "Sara, we don't want that, it's communist." Sara replied, "That's OK, dad" and took Red Flag.

To Defeat Fascism, Destroy Its **Roots in Capitalism**

Here's the contradiction. March organizers pushed hard for people to wrap themselves in the US flag. To put their hope in the US Constitution, peaceful protest, and democracy. To blame Trump personally for fascism.

"As if Democratic presidents have never harmed the masses," remarked another comrade. "As if Obama hadn't been the 'Deporterin-Chief.' As if the last mass deportations in LA hadn't happened under Carter.

"Instead of organizing for 'no kings' the workers should be organizing for revolution from this system," he continued. "This system which chooses which vulnerable part of the working class it's time to

superexploit and scapegoat. Historically, Black people, Indigenous people, and women have felt this the hardest. LGBQT+, Asians, Muslims, and now our immigrant family members have become the new punching

masses with armed violence," he concluded. "Working-class struggle and eventual revolution will require violence in order to win an equitable world for all."

Three people tried to give another comrade a US flag. "I don't want that flag," she told them. "The only flag we need is the red flag of the international working class."

National flags symbolize the politics of nationalism. Nationalism tries to erase class struggle by getting workers to identify with the capitalist bosses who exploit them and send them to war. They divide workers from our class siblings around the world. Patriotism enslaves us. It cannot liberate us.

What is Fascism?

"Fascist" can describe people or an ideology. But "fascism" is a stage of capitalism.

The British communist R. Palme Dutt analyzed it in 1934. Fascism arises, he argued, when old capitalist institutions break down. Amid this crisis, the working class should be able to seize power. But instead it is restrained by reformist leadership. The disaffected masses thus become easy prey for the forces of reaction – for fascism.

Dutt wrote mainly about the rise of Nazism in Germany. But similar conditions exist today almost everywhere in the world. There is a ism. And an environmental crisis. And many levels of social crisis. Imperialist alliances and capitalist institutions are failing. Wars are spreading and intensifying.

The global working class is larger and more international than ever. And more impoverished. More desperate. It should be able to use its mighty power - including the working-class soldiers and sailors in its ranks – to liberate us all from capitalism.

But everywhere it is restrained by reformist leadership. Like in the "No Kings" protests. "Stay peaceful." "Get out the vote for Democrats." "Defend the constitution." Anything to divert the angry masses from communist revolution.

Now, as in 1934, the choice is not "democracy or fascism." It's communism or fascism. Fascist regimes mostly have constitutions. Often, they have elections. Let's learn from nearly a century of heroic struggles and tragic failures: Capitalist democracy paves the way for fascism.

We, like many who marched, are hopeful, not cynical. The stakes are real. The dangers are present, but so too are the opportunities.

For a Communist World Without Borders: **BUILD RELATIONSHIPS WITH INDUSTRIAL WORKERS INSIDE FACTORIES**

TACOMA USA), June 6— The United States has been built on the labor and lives of Indigenous and enslaved peoples and immigrants. The leadership of big unions in the Pacific Northwest, such as the International Association of Machinists and Aerospace Workers (IAM) at Boeing and IAM District Lodge160, had never called for a rally to protect immigrants. Not until this month.

Eight years ago, ICWP organized to stop production in a Boeing plant the first time Trump separated migrant families. The union bigshots were nowhere to be found.

On May 15, 2025, Maximo Londonio, a member of IAM District 160, was arrested as he stepped off his plane at Sea-Tac Airport. He was returning from the Philippines, where he and his wife celebrated their 20th wedding anniversary with their daughter. He has held a green card (permanent residency) for over 20 years.

This time, union headquarters stepped in, calling for a rally at the Northwest Detention Center in Tacoma. There is one reason they did.

"It's because the rank-and-file forced the leadership to allow it," declared a comrade.

For months, comrades and friends have distributed Red Flag and talked to the Boeing workforce at the factory gates. Many workers come from immigrant families.



They are eager to discuss how to defeat fascism and genocide with communist revolution.

The union leaders' change in rhetoric is not limited to the detention of Maximo Londonio. The speechmaking has changed among industrial unions' leadership, but their alliance with the Democratic party remains.

This alliance insures continued capitalist exploitation, wage slavery, racist attacks and forced deportation.

Only communism can end deportations. Communist revolution will open the door to a world where all workers are welcome everywhere. The horror of capitalist profits and wage slavery will be no match for an unleashed working class. Collective production will provide for the needs of the masses.

Friends We Met; Friends Who Knew Our Comrades

The multi-racial rally included young and old, men and women leaders, union and non-union, and protesters from around the world.

ICWP comrades talked to a worker from the Boeing Auburn plant, north of Tacoma. Within minutes, this machinist stopped the conversation.

"I remember you," he said to comrades. "You and your friends gave a speech about the World Trade Organization when we were organizing against the Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation."

> He is trying to build an Action Committee inside the factory. He asked us to join the conversation. We are bringing our communist ideas to meetings with active Boeing workers.

Los Angeles (USA): Union Reformism Diverts Workers from Communist Revolution

"We have to organize immigrant workers from the pulpit," said Cardinal Mahoney. He was speaking to union officials and community organizations in Los Angeles' Alameda Corridor in 1994. "If we don't, the communists will."

This followed the 1992 riots sparked by the televised police beating of Rodney King.

The Alameda Corridor runs along the railroad to the harbor. It was once home to a multi-racial workforce at Bethlehem Steel, Firestone Tires, and General Motors. It had become a wasteland. About three hundred unionized heavy industry factories had closed during the 1970s and 80s.

This also happened in the US 'industrial heartland." US imperialism began its long decline. Capitalists in Japan, Germany, South Korea, and eventually China began to beat out US capitalism

Meanwhile, tens of thousands of refugees from the US-backed civil wars in Central America were arriving in Los Angeles. Many got jobs in small garment sweatshops. Communists who are now in the ICWP organized in those factories, building an Anti-Racist Garment Union. We now fight directly for communism, not reforms.

who recently returned from the Philippines. It was a dangerous trip. One of his friends was red tagged. Red tags label individuals and organizations as "communist terrorists."

When the teamster returned, he and some of his friends decided to build an international labor working group. He asked us to sign up. The teamster and IAM Boeing worker both took copies of Red Flag and ICWP leaflets.

While we were talking with them, another comrade distributed Red Flag and our leaflets among union members and activists. She

Other immigrant workers found jobs as janitors in big office buildings, hotels, and restaurants. The bosses' unions never organized the Alameda Corridor warehouses that replaced the factories. They did, however, organize the immigrant janitors, and hotel and restaurant workers.

Those unions now dominate California labor. They constitute the mass base of the California Democratic Party. By organizing immigrant workers for reforms, they hope to divert their anger from communist revolution.

On June 6, federal agents arrested David Huerta, president of the statewide janitor's union. He was outside a Los Angeles garment warehouse. Protestors were denouncing a workplace immigration raid there. Democratic governor Newsom called Huerta a "respected leader, a patriot, and an advocate for working people."

The unions and the Democratic party do their best to organize immigrant workers (and all workers) to support patriotism. And to fight for crumbs.

Anti-Racist Struggle Opens Doors to More Communist Organizing

A comrade who joined ICWP five years ago said, "Capitalist bosses have learned to divide the working class by caste, religion, ethnicity, language, gender, nationality, and more. They make workers feel jealous, weak, greedy. They create the education, culture, and fashion industries to get us to accept the system as it is.

"But when we work long hours in a factory like Hyundai, we see our power for a change," he continued. "Recently, a worker from Assam was mistreated by his supervisor. The supervisor abused him, calling him 'Chinese,' 'ugly,' and 'lazy.' "

Workers knew the worker as very friendly. During a lunch break, workers discussed this racist attack. Soon, hundreds of workers became aware of it. They warned the supervisor. The supervisor came with an armed bodyguard. That made workers very angry. "After a lunch break, we organized a protest to stop work. The management backed off and reassigned the racist supervisor."

This provided us with a significant opportunity to distribute Red Flag to workers' homes. We explained that reassigning a supervisor

LOS ANGELES COUNTY, June 13—"My sister accidentally found herself in the middle of the confrontation in Paramount," a comrade reported. That was June 7, the second day of Trump's intensified immigration raids in Los Angeles County.

"People in cars were saying, 'ICE, ICE!' It felt like a war zone," the distraught sister told family in Compton, across the freeway. ICE came in like it was an emergency. Everyone was traumatized, hearing helicopters overhead.

The comrade's brother and sisterin-law went to look. They bypassed the LA County Sheriffs and documented tear gas attacks on protesters who hadn't yet thrown anything. They were told to walk away, but people were targeted as they walked away. Ambulances couldn't get to the injured people.

This immigrant family - some undocumented – was more angry than afraid. The sister-in-law works with undocumented and unhoused people, but this is the first time club. Another comrade noted that

she's gotten active. She, her husband, and the comrade joined the protests in downtown LA the next night.

"We were managing traffic at Alameda and Temple," the comrade reported. "There were lots of young kids. This was brand new for them. We told them not to block the streets.

"I met an agitator," she continued. "He wanted to throw something at the cops from where we were all protesting. I said, 'If you're going to do it, go right up to them but don't do it in this group where you're going to get someone hurt.' He left. We left soon after. Things were getting too hot."

The comrade's traumatized sister, angry at first, then flipped. "I don't want to be involved if they are looting and setting fires," she said.

"Nonviolence doesn't mean we can't defend ourselves," the comrade replied. "But attacking police is a needless risk."

She reported all this to our Party

protesters burned four self-driving taxis because their cameras pointed in all directions. They were being used to spy on protesters.

And there wasn't much looting. In Little Tokyo, when a few people tried to break into a store, other protesters stopped them.

By the time we met, there had been a week of mass protests. Another comrade had distributed Red *Flag* at a labor rally. She then had lunch with a friend who'd also attended. The comrade had joined a noisy rally outside a hotel where ICE was staying, distributing 100 more copies of *Red Flag*. Later the hotel told ICE to leave. Since then, protests have spread to many other hotels, forcing ICE out of some.

Where Is the "Front Line"?

A bus operator who reads Red Flag told a distributor, "I didn't think you'd be here. I thought you'd be at the front lines, kicking a cop in the shins."

"This is the front line," she replied. "The working class is the front line. You are."

Angry masses desperately seek to stop or slow down the inhuman fascist deportation machine. They defy cops and curfews. They patrol neighborhoods to warn of ICE sightings. They urge workers to "know your rights." They document ICE kidnappings. They try to surround ICE vehicles. They mobilize communities. Sometimes they succeed in freeing people.

But we are up against capitalist state power. Resistance – peaceful or otherwise - is not enough. We must resist in ways that help us prepare for communist revolution. For overthrowing the capitalist state. For destroying its roots in capitalist wage slavery. For creating liberated zones, and then a world, where every worker belongs and nobody is a "foreigner."

That's why the "front line" of the fight against the ICE Gestapo is the struggle to spread Red Flag to workers and soldiers. They are the key to communist revolution.

"My daughters don't want me to go to the march. They're afraid, and I am too, a little. But I'm going to go, pick me up." He is an undocumented immigrant. It was the June 14th march, and the police, the National Guard, and possibly

immigration agents would be there. We didn't know how many people would come. There was a lot of uncertainty.

"For the first time, my son wants to go to the march to protest against deportations and we are going to go together. See you there!" said a Red Flag reader.



They are both citizens.

A woman grew up as a sympathizer, around ICWP, but not an activist. She called me and asked, "Is the party going to go to the march?"

I told her, "Yes, we're going to be there." She, her husband, and a sister came to our contingent with their own political signs, and a lot of emotion, showing their unhappiness with capitalism's attacks on the working class.

A couple without legal documents, and their citizen son, very close to the ICWP, came to our group shouting loudly at the top of their lungs, "Workers' Struggles Have No Borders, Power to the Workers!" We replied. "Power to the Workers!"

The anger of workers and young students is much greater than their fear. There is a lot of fear in the general atmosphere because of the thousands that

have been deported and the violent attacks by the fascist repressive forces against those who have opposed the raids. But after each attack, thousands more come out.

These actions have given us more potential to sharpen the struggle with these youth and others so we can recruit them to the Party and the struggle for Communism.

At the march, thousands of people kept coming: white, Black, Latinx, Asian, and others. It was an atmosphere of protest. The undocumented comrade mentioned at the beginning handed out Red Flags to those thousands like hot cakes. He was part of the struggle for a Communist World without Borders.

Once again, the feeling of a communist world overcame the fear of fascist terror.

Imperialist Conflict Sharpens in the Middle East WORKERS MUST NOT SIDE WITH ANY CAPITALIST RULERS

June 24— "The Iranian regime has created shelters for bombs but not for people," said an Iranian comrade. "Food prices have doubled overnight." Another worker said, "This warmongering has emptied our stomachs. This system has to go."

"Netanyahu is getting rid of any checks on his power to establish allout fascist tyranny," said a comrade in Tel Aviv. "There is no way out but communist revolution."

Israeli warplanes and drones struck key Iranian nuclear and military facilities on June 12, killing top generals and scientists.

The Zionist rulers claimed this was necessary before Iran got closer to building an atomic weapon. Experts and even the US government had assessed that Iran was not getting closer. But US President Trump crowed about "our" success.

Iran retaliated with swarms of ballistic missiles exploding over Jerusalem and Tel Aviv. Israel threatened to destroy residential neighborhoods in Tehran.



Trump – after lying about "negotiations"—sent US fighters to drop bunker-buster bombs on an Iranian underground nuclear site. The Iranian rulers staged a token attack on Al Udeid in Qatar, the largest and most fortified US base in the region.

All these governments lie, so it's hard to know how much damage was done anywhere.

As we go to press, a shaky ceasefire seems to be holding. The Iranian and Israeli capitalist governments are both dominated by fascists wrapping themselves in religious garb. Both – and the imperialist US government as well – face conflicts within the ruling class. All face growing anger from the masses they oppress.

These conditions – including the expanding wars – demand a communist revolutionary response. We must build the International Communist Workers' Party everywhere to make that revolution possible.

Energy, Oil, and Imperialist War

The US is behind Israel. China and Russia are behind

Iran, which is part of the BRICS alliance. There is always a danger that this conflict could spiral toward World War III. However, both the US and Chinese imperialists seem to be preparing for that war in the Pacific, not the Middle East.

The US and Iranian rulers have fought since Iran's US-backed Shah was overthrown in 1979. Before that, the US helped jump-start Iran's nuclear energy program. Since then there have been decades of negotia-



tions, inspections, threats, sanctions, and more. Nothing had changed recently.

Mideast oil is at stake. Iran holds almost 10% of the world's petroleum reserves. It controls the strategic Strait of Hormuz. China gets 30% of its oil from Iran. But the new China-Iran railway makes it less dependent on the Strait of Hormuz. India once got most of its oil from Iran. Now it imports more from Russia.

No "Good Capitalists" or "Lesser-evil" Imperialists

Many worldwide rightfully hate US imperialism. The only ruling class that used nuclear bombs in war. That used its dominant position after World War II to overthrow regimes from Iran's Mossadegh to Guatemala's Arbenz and Lumumba in Congo. To super-exploit workers in Haiti, the Philippines, and more.

But that doesn't make the Iranian rulers into heroes! They too are fascist exploiters. They are currently repressing a mass strike of truck drivers. Strikes of steel and sugar workers in 2017-18 sparked waves of anti-government protests. Same with energy and petrochemical workers' strikes in 2020-2021. The 2022 "women-life-freedom" movement challenged Iran's fascist rulers. We must side with the Iranian masses, not back their oppressors.

Limited wars can be useful to capitalist rulers. They can help build patriotism (nationalism) and suppress dissent. Let's not be fooled!

Let's answer the rulers' nationalism and war with communist revolution. The system has to go!

June 24— A two-month long nationwide strike continues to roll through Panama. This, despite increasing repression. Thousands of workers who cultivate Chiquita bananas. Construction workers and school workers. They and many others walked out and marched. They have defied a "state of emergency" and mass retaliatory layoffs.

Strikers oppose privatization of pensions. They denounce ecologically dangerous mining projects. And Panamanian politicians' capitulation to US imperialism.

Strikers have received mass support. From students and doctors. Indigenous groups and feminist collectives. And more.

GENOCIDE IN PALESTINE: "WE ARE ALL STARVING FOR REVOLUTION"

June 23—The Zionist regime in Israel blocks food from entering Gaza. And medical aid. And energy. Hospitals go dark. Water pumps fail. Deadly air strikes continue. One million children in Gaza are at risk of starvation. So are a million adults. Thousands are near the brink of death.

The GHF, a joint operation of Israel and US mercenaries, brings a mere trickle of food to a handful of distribution sites. These sites were designed to be traps. Since distributions began on May 27, Israeli attacks on starving and desperate Palestinians near them have killed over 400 and wounded over 1000.

This is genocide. It is a genocidal policy of "ethnic cleansing." The Zionist rulers and their US imperialist partners intend to destroy the Palestinian population as such. To disperse those they don't kill to Libya. Or to Jordan. Or to who knows where in a second Nakba, completing the expulsion that began in 1948.

In the West Bank, Zionist occupation troops stand by or assist as fascist settlers drive tens of thousands of Bedouin and Palestinian farmers from their homes, villages, and land. In Syria, Zionist troops occupy the Mount Hermon area.

"Between the [Mediterranean] Sea and the Jordan [River] there will only be Israeli sovereignty," declared Israel's Likud Party 1977 platform. Netanyahu's government – with US support – is making this a reality. With "no Palestinians allowed."

Will US-Israeli genocidal fascism succeed? Nothing has stopped it so far. Not Iran's "axis of resistance." Not condemnations of global humanitarian organizations. Not mass protests that continue to grow worldwide. Not Greta Thunberg and the Madleen's symbolic effort to deliver aid.

"Egyptian masses are ready to invade the Rafah border," reports a comrade in Egypt. "But Sisi and his fascist army are depriving people of necessities. The cost of the basic Aish Baladi (Egyptian bread) has quadrupled. People are calling for 'baladi intifada' like in 1977 when the hungry people joined the soldiers."

Anti-genocide forces are growing within Israel, including among

military and ex-military. Comrades of the International Communist Workers' Party stand proudly among them. Other Israelis have "voted with their feet" by leaving the country. But Zionism's racist propaganda still has a hold on far too many Jewish Israelis.

Palestinians in Gaza are weakened by hunger and continual attacks. But even in Nazi death camps, prisoners found ways to resist and rebel. Palestinians will too.

in Palestine and everywhere. And it will!

LOS ANGELES (USA), June fight their own families." 14—Faced with growing resistance to the ICE reign of terror, Trump sent in four thousand reserve soldiers from the California National Guard and 700 Marines. He hoped to provoke more disturbances for TV. Instead, he gave ICWP comrades an opportunity to talk to our class siblings in uniform.

As we approached soldiers guarding the West LA Federal Building, each ICWP member had to overcome a certain level of anxiety. After all, the soldiers are in a position of power-armed power and power to dismiss our conversations. But the reality is that we have more in common with them than we (or they) have with Trump, ICE, and the LA Police. And this connection is what allowed us to talk to them, even though officers attempted to stop the interaction.

With a simple "Welcome to LA" from our side and friendly smile on their side, we were able to spark conversations and elevate them to political discussions. One soldier said that being called up was a "gut punch," clearly making a connection with the people in the streets protesting the ICE raids.

One soldier that took our literature said, "I'm on duty, but I'll read it during our break. We'll share with our friends."

Most of the soldiers that we talked to took flyers, and our Military pamphlet. One soldier refused. But then he looked over to his comrade in arms to his right as if to say, do you want them? We offered them to him, and he took them.

Two days later, we ran into some of the same soldiers stationed around the Federal Courthouse downtown. We continued the conversation. Four of them took our pamphlet: "Fight for the Day When No Worker Will Be Called Foreigner."



tinued: "I have more in common with Gazan workers than I have with Trump. I urge soldiers to use their own mind and turn the guns around in any situation that seems like an injustice to the working class. Workers who take the streets are reacting to the racism, sexism, and homophobia that capitalism creates. In the International Com-

They give us access to military weapons, vehicles, and equipment and expect us to use these same resources against hard working people trying to survive this racist capitalist system. In fact, they force us to use these resources on workers around the world like what happened in Iraq and Vietnam.

vehicles.

But things change. VW bosses face rising production costs in Europe due to the Ukraine-Russia war. They are turning to Africa, where China already has a strong presence. They believe that by 2035,

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YOUTH DAY: THE INTERNATIONAL WORKING CLASS IS OUR PEOPLE

GQEBERHA (South Africa), June 16— "Young people are the future," said a student comrade. "Today we remember the youths that fought against oppression. We remind ourselves that these present young people and students are the leaders of a communist future and fighters against capitalism".

This opened our commemoration of the schoolkids killed in the 1976 Soweto massacre by the South African apartheid regime. They fought for liberation. Today we remember their heroic call for action by recruiting young people to fight the oppressive and exploitative capitalist system.

The same capitalist oppressors who benefited from apartheid still benefit today at the expense of young people. The South African capitalist government is not "white". The capitalists use their state governed by Black people to exploit the masses and rob young people of their future.

More than twenty young students discussed two questions. What role can we play in shaping the communist future? Who are we fighting for?

We often hear that the schoolchildren of 1976 fought for "our people". Who are our people?

One comrade said, "We are fighting for our people who are here, who are hungry and don't have anything, who can't afford to live a proper life". Other comrades agreed.

An experienced party comrade asked, "Do we mean who are in this meeting or who are in Port Elizabeth (Gqeberha), or in South Africa?"

Internationalism Versus Nationalism

Another comrade said, "It seems that comrades mean 'South Africans'". Comrades encouraged each other to have an honest and free discussion around what they deem "foreigners".

Comrade T said, "I feel foreigners have taken our jobs and given our kids drugs. Hence, they kill the future of young people". Another comrade agreed. "They are not our people. They come illegally and do crime".

Other comrades refuted these remarks in a comradely manner until the comrades saw that what they were saying about immigrants was wrong. It's dangerous capitalist propaganda to pit the workers against each other.

Comrade S said, "All immigrants live under capitalism. The conditions created by the brutal capitalist system here in South Africa, they also face where they were born. The jobs we say they 'stole': that is wrong, because they are employed by capitalists who want cheap labour from them. Once they become immigrants, their situation becomes even worse. They live under terrible and desperate conditions. They are forced to accept very low wages just to survive and send something to their families".

He continued: "Some immigrants commit crimes. But saying immigrants bring crime is no different from racists who say Black people are criminals because some criminals are Black. We must fight the system that makes them desperate. If they are exploited in the same manner as any worker, or even worse, are they not our people?"

Comrade TH said, "They are our people, comrades. In Addo an immigrant who had been here for years was brutally attacked because one immigrant in the area had killed someone. They targeted everyone who's an immigrant".



Comrade Q said, "We shouldn't be like those people. We should fight against that. We should unite with all immigrants and win them over. We must unite all workers of the world from anywhere. That's how we win. Even those from corners we have never heard of should join the party.

"The role of the youth", she continued, "is to recruit energetically and not let any capitalist propaganda into their minds. The biggest example of 'us versus foreigners' is what's happening in Gaza. Thousands are being killed by Israel because they are regarded as unwanted foreigners. Even in Ukraine and Russia, people are being killed because the other side says they are 'not our people'".

"We are international. We should follow our name", commented comrade C. "The youth will liberate us, and the youth will be better than us".

Comrades reflected on the fight against Trump's racist deportations of immigrants from the US. We should never allow a situation like that in South Africa. We should recruit more, educate ourselves through the communist line, and reject capitalist propaganda. As comrade Q said, "we should be like those in the US who are standing up against Trump, but we should be standing up against capitalism with our communist line. You touch one, you touch all of us".

We plan to have such a political struggle around ICWP's communist line to fight against nationalism and other capitalist thinking from new comrades.

At the end, we asked primary school kids what they know about Youth Day and what they would like to change at school. An eleven-yearold girl said, "I would like to end the treatment kids who are not from here get. When one has done something wrong, they get shouted at and taken to the office. But us from here don't get that".

Our struggle continues! We fight for a communist world with no xenophobia or borders to divide us!

WORKERS AND STUDENTS ANSWER FACTORY LAYOFFS, MASS UNEMPLOYMENT BY ORGANIZING FOR COMMUNISM

19 — Goodyear has just announced the closure of a plant that produces tires for the adjacent Volkswagen assembly plant. With this closure, nine hundred workers will lose their jobs. This adds to the official unemployment rate of 48% in Kariega (Uitenhage). For Lwazi, the sole breadwinner in his family, this is a calamity. His three sons are also unemployed.

Just four km away is the township of KwaNobuhle. It's home to many industrial workers and their families. A young comrade named Siya is distributing *Red Flag* door to door. She is also organizing students at her school to join the International Communist Workers' Party (ICWP). are forced to stand due to a shortage of furniture. There are no textbooks. Last year, her class went without a mathematics teacher. Math is a required subject to graduate. In response, Comrade Siya organized 250 high school students to stage a toyitoyi protest at the administration building. They demanded the hiring of a math teacher from Johannesburg.

Siya and other ICWP members, including a comrade from Volkswagen, recently attended a youth meeting. They discussed the significance of the 1976 Soweto Rebellion. That historic protest began when the apartheid government killed hundreds of youths. Today, mined to overthrow the repressive capitalist system and replace it with communism. Communism is a system where workers share resources based on the needs of the international working class.

Siya now understands that hiring one math teacher is not enough. What is needed is a communist education system. All workers and students learn from one another to build a new society—one without banks, capitalist bosses, or money.

Capitalist "Master Plans" are nothing but plans to exploit workers.

At the Goodyear plant, we spoke with an executive from Volkswagen

Automotive Masterplan 2035. She explained that although VW had previously bought tires from Goodyear, in recent years they have been importing them to cut costs. "We're now buying from India, where production costs are 80% lower than in South Africa," she said.

This is how capitalism works. In pursuit of profit, bosses shift production to countries with lower wages. According to the Masterplan, Africa's population is projected to reach 2.5 billion by 2035, with one billion under the age of seventeen.
